In French I, you will:

converse, write, listen, and read in present and future tenses about food, houses, possessions, family, school, and places in a town. You will write letters and dialogues, and make a scrapbook. You will perform scenes which take place in a café, at an exchange program office, and on the street.

You will accomplish these things by:

taking an active role in your learning through note-taking, completing assignments, doing reading, listening, writing, and speaking activities in pairs, groups, or on your own, playing games, singing songs, and watching videos and Power Point demonstrations.

What you'll need to be successful:

- o A 1" 3-ring binder (or pocket folder with clips)
- o A pencil and/or blue or black pen (no other colors, please!)
- o Loose leaf paper or a spiral notebook in the binder
I recommend buying a small French/English dictionary, but it is not required.
- o My classroom contribution (optional): wipes kleenex 4-pk dry erase

You get one free homework pass per marking period!!

3. Take two days for every absence day to complete your make-up work. Ask for help if necessary!
